The 39th Gibbscorp National Javelin Championships were held at the Perth Dinghy Sailing Club from the 27th of December 2009 the 4th of January.

The regatta attracted a fleet of 26 boats with representatives from Victoria, Esperance and Western Australia attending including young 49er Olympic hopeful Robbie Gibbs to compete.

The Javelin class is enjoying a growth in all areas due its continued support of both younger and older sailors to race in a very competitive fleet. It is proving to be one of the most exciting classes to

sail on the river recently taking out the Department of Marine and Harbours speed challenge in the monohull section. For more info on the class see the website at www.javelins.org

This year, 2010, is the 50th year of the Javelin class in Australia and New Zealand and the Nationals along with the South Pacific Championships will be held in Melbourne over the Christmas and New Year period on the Mornington Peninsular at McCrae Yacht Club.

This year's regatta was very professionally run by Mr Kim Peaker from South Perth donating his time along with the time of many volunteers from PDSC which made it one of the best regattas for the class in a long time.

There was a mixture of breezes ranging from 2 knots through to 18 knots providing some close and exciting racing amongst the fleet.

The boats from Melbourne dominated in the light variable conditions with Liquor Box - Brett Taylor and John Newman winning 4 heats and Himalayan Woman - Aaron Hirst and Paul Newman winning 2 heats. The remaining 3 heats were won by Ronstan Racing Red - Russell Hanrahan and Chris Woodward in somewhat fresher conditions.

The championship was one by Liquor Box with a heat to spare but the minor placings were up for grabs going into the last heat.
